

JUBILEE YEAR OF MERCY For this Extraordinary Jubilee of Mercy, Bishop Gaydos has de-signated five church as pilgrimage sites at which there will be a Holy Door of Mercy and the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence for the Jubilee. Those churches are 1. *The Cathedral of St. Joseph*; 2. *The Church of St. Peter* in Brush Creek (where Fr. Augustine Tolton was baptized, whose cause for canonization is in process); 3. *St.*

Joseph in Edina; 4. The church of St. Patrick in Laurie in honor of the Shrine of Mary, Mother of the Church (at the lake of the Ozarks) 5. The shrine of Our Lady of Sorrows in Starkenburg. You are all encouraged to make a pilgrimage to receive the Lord's mercy and to share that mercy with others
