EPIPHANY OF THE LORD

How did Matthew's "mixed community," converts from Judaism and converts from Gentile religions, deal with today's story of the magi, whose searching for Jesus caused Herod to be "greatly troubled, and all Jerusalem with him"? Imagine the conversation! From Jewish converts, schooled from childhood to appreciate their privileged status as God's chosen: "How are Gentiles now included, since the Messiah comes from our people?" (Paul marvels over that in today's Ephesians reading.) From Gentile converts: "But if you Chosen People had all the prophecies, how is it all Jews have not yet become Christians?"

Enlightened by their most advanced wisdom, the magi followed the star, which brought them close—but not all the way! For human reason's star stopped at the city where divine revelation was enshrined. Only after enlightenment by Jewish scripture did Gentile reason find Jesus. Yet the keepers of that revelation stayed behind with the wicked king. Reason indeed needs revelation; but revelation still needs grace to leave the comfortable past for the challenging future.

Today's magi are legion—men and women of science and statecraft, devotees of art and culture, people of good will

with good hearts, whose searching, far from "troubling" us, should challenge us to deepen our understanding of the revelation we have received and to appreciate the gifts modern seekers still bring. We are called to find Christ *together*, even if we already know where Christ is; and with all who seek Christ, to be changed by that encounter, to "return to our own country," our daily world, "by another way."

QUESTIONS OF THE WEEK

As I begin this new year, on what situation in my life right now do I need to let God's peace descend and enfold me? How can I allow God to make me an instrument of such peace to someone I know?

Whom can I help lead to Christ in this new year? Among the searchers I know, who might challenge me to seek Christ more intensely?
