Spectacles were dispensed and 1 man was identified for a cataract operation. We thank local nurses and opticians for their help.



This time we took soap moulds to the blind group and we saw the first bars they produced. Candle moulds would also be useful.



A visit to Kerugoya District Hospital provided dressings and surgical equipment for their use. We took new baby clothes donated by The Cherish Foundation to the New Born Ward and also to 2 local clinics.



New Bibles also kindly donated through the Cherish Foundation were given to Bishop Francis Wanderi receiving these on behalf of The Peoples Church.

Bibles kindly supplied by Gideon's were handed out at the Kagio Medical Camp.



Plans forward include a visit to a local school probably late January 2016 to examine and dispense spectacles as necessary
